# 'I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End'.

There are two books in our Bible which start "In the beginning...". The first chapter of the book of Genesis gives an account of Creation. In six stages, we move from an earth formless and empty with the Spirit of God hovering over the waters [Genesis 1: 2] to a world populated with all types of plants, animals and mankind, and described as 'very good'. [Genesis 1: 31] The Gospel of St John begins with an explanation of the true identity of Jesus, the Word, who in the beginning was with God and was God. [John 1: 1].

By searching our Bibles, we can discover many other names which are used to describe Jesus. At His baptism God described Jesus as His **beloved Son** [Matthew 3: 13-17, Mark 1:9–11, Luke 3: 21–23]. Jesus often referred to Himself as the **Son of Man** [e.g. Mark 8: 31] which is derived from one of the visions of Daniel where "**there came one like a son of man**" who was given power over all peoples by the Ancient of Days [Daniel 7: 13,14].

This Sunday's Collect identifies The Eternal Lord as "our beginning and end". In John's vision, recorded in the book of Revelation, the term 'Alpha and Omega", appears three times in the words of Jesus transmitted by the trusted Angel [Revelation 1:8, 21: 6 & 22: 13]. Jesus introduces Himself as 'Him who is, and who was, and who is to come'. Alpha and Omega are symbolic as the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet signifying a beginning and an ending. Jesus was present at the beginning of Creation and will be present at the end when all the divine mysteries will be revealed.

### Making Disciples. [John 1: 35-50]

The term disciple can be used to describe a pupil or follower of any teacher who accepts their doctrines and attempts to spread them to others.

John the Baptist began his mission at a time described very clearly in Luke's Gospel [Luke 3: 1, 2]. He preached a Baptism of Repentance as he prepared the way for Jesus and had attracted some disciples. On the day after John had baptised Jesus, John was talking to two of his disciples when Jesus walked past. John described Jesus as the *Lamb of God*. The two disciples immediately followed Jesus and spent the rest of the day with Him. One of these disciples was Andrew who was Simon Peter's brother. He went and told Simon Peter that 'we have found the Messiah' [John 1: 41] and brought him to Jesus.

The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee and found Phillip and called him to follow. Phillip then fetched Nathaniel who was initially sceptical about anything good coming from Nazareth but was urged to come to Jesus anyway.

As we contemplate these first Disciples we should remember that, around three years later, they were to witness at first hand the events of Holy Week, Good Friday and Easter Sunday and become, at Pentecost, the beginnings of the Christian Church. It is our duty, as members of that same Church, to enable others to meet with Jesus.

### **Annual Report and Annual Church Meetings:**

As the new year starts, your PCC must look back at the events of 2023 and produce its Annual Report to be presented, in due course, to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. Do you have any contributions to make to this report? Have you been involved in the organisation of any events or group activities during the year? If so, then we need a report from you!

This report also has to be lodged with the Charity Commission to fulfil their requirements. This will be available online along with reports from previous years.

**But what of 2024?** How can **you** contribute to the life of our Churches? There are many small tasks that need to be done to ensure the smooth running of our services and activities. Most of these tasks have devolved to a small group of individuals who are in danger of becoming overloaded.
