People of Faith Abram - Abraham

The family line of Noah's son Shem [Genesis 11: 10-26] brings us through eight generations to Terah, with no references to their relationships to the LORD. Terah was the father of Abram, Nahor and Haran and was living in the city of Ur of the Chaldeans in the southern area of modern Iraq. Abram married Sarai and Nahor married Milkah. [Genesis 11: 27-29] Terah decided to move his family to Canaan but only reached Harran in modern day Türkiye where they settled.

It was here that the Lord spoke to Abram. He was told to set off on a journey to an unknown place with a promise that "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you." Abram obeyed and reached Shechem where the Lord appeared to him and made another promise that the area around Shechem, then occupied by the Canaanites would become the homeland of his offspring. One of the many local famines forced Abram to travel down to Egypt. Whilst there Abram insisted that Sarai was his sister and she attracted the attention of Pharoah. However, the Lord inflicted serious diseases on Pharoah's household and Pharoah sent Abram on his way [Genesis 12: 17-20] This brought Abram back to the land of the Canaanites where he settled at Hebron.

There the Lord appeared again to Abram in a vision. Despite the earlier promise, Abram had a problem believing since Sarai was childless and not able to conceive. [Genesis 11: 30]. The Lord repeated His promise that Sarai would bear a son. Abram believed the Lord, and He credited it to him as righteousness. [Genesis 15: 6] Some years later the Lord appeared again to Abram and repeated His promise. Abram and Sarai received new names Abraham and Sarah as a sign of their covenant with the Lord.

Sarah became pregnant and bore a son who was named Isaac. Some years later the LORD tested Abraham. He was commanded to take Isaac to the region of Moriah and to sacrifice him on one of the mountains. Abraham obeyed the command and just as he was about to perform the sacrifice of his son, the Angel of the Lord intervened to stop him. In a nearby thicket was a ram which was sacrificed instead of Isaac. The promise that Abraham's descendants would be as numerous as the stars in the sky and as the sand on the seashore was confirmed. [Genesis 22: 11]. Among one of Abraham's last tasks was to find a wife for Isaac from among his extended family rather than from the local Canaanites. He sent his senior servant to see Nahor. There he was pointed by the LORD to Rebekkah [Genesis 24: 12-54] Rebekkah returned with the servant, and married Isaac. When Abraham died he was buried in a cave near Mamre, in the field of Ephron, which Abraham had bought from the Hittites some years earlier.
