A departure and a promise

In the few weeks since Easter we have remembered some of the times when the risen Jesus joined with his Disciples. In his letter to the Church at Corinth St Paul reminds his readers of the Gospel he had preached to them. He included a list of some the post-Resurrection Appearances including one to a group of more than five hundred brothers and sisters, many of whom could give confirmation [1 Corinthians 15: 6].

During this coming week we will commemorate the final earthly meeting between Jesus and his Disciples in Jerusalem. We are told that the "ears of the Disciples were opened" so that they could "finally understand the Scriptures". The Messiah would suffer and rise on the third day and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached in his name to all nations. They were His witnesses and would start the process in Jerusalem. [Luke 24: 25-28]

Jesus then confirmed that they would be clothed with power from on high [Luke 24: 49]. Whilst speaking to the Disciples after the Last Supper, Jesus had promised them another Advocate, the Spirit of truth. [John 14: 16,17]

In the final event [for now!] of His ministry on earth, Jesus took His Disciples to a place near Bethany where He blessed them as He was taken up into Heaven, hidden from their sight in a cloud. [Luke 24: 50,51; Acts 1: 9].

What a change came over the disciples. Just forty days earlier they were meet ing in a locked room for fear of the Jewish leaders. [John 20: 19]. Once they returned to Jerusalem, they stayed continually at the temple, praising God. [Luke 24: 53]
