Pentecost - confusion to clarity

Dobro jutro, Доброе утро, Godmorgen, Guten Morgen. Are you confused? If so **Good Morning**, might help you greet someone in Croatia, Russia, Denmark or Germany.

In the book of Genesis we read about a time when, following the Flood, the whole world had *one language and a common speech* [Genesis 11: 1]. As they travelled eastward, they found a plain in Shinar, in the region of southern Mesopotamia identified as Babylonia and present day Iraq. The people decided to establish themselves as a distinct group by building a city with a tower reaching to the Heavens. They made and used bricks rather than stone and used tar for mortar. [Genesis 11: 4]

However, the Lord came to see the city and realised that as a single group they would become all powerful and nothing would be impossible for them. The Lord made the decision to confuse their language so that they could not understand each other. The people were scattered and work on the city and tower ceased [Genesis 11: 8] We may ientify the building as the Tower of Babel with its name thought to be derived from the Hebrew *bālal* meaning to confuse or confound

The Feast of Weeks, *Shavuot*, is celebrated fifty days after Passover and marks the end of the grain Harvest. It is one of the three Pilgrimage Festivals when all the Israelites were expected to make the pilgrimage to Jerusalem to join the celebrations in the Temple. (Exodus 34: 22, 23]. The alternative name of Pentecost is derived from the Greek for fifty.

The Disciples had gathered in a room to celebrate the feast. Suddenly they heard the sound of a mighty wind and saw tongues of fire descending on them. The promised Holy Spirit had come to them, and they began to speak in other languages. [Acts 2: 1-4]. As they went out on the streets they found groups of visitors from all parts of the then known world - Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs [Acts 2: 9-11]. All these were amazed that they could hear and understand the disciples in their own languages even though the speakers were dismissed as just Galileans. They were also thought to be drunk. Peter stood up and denied this allegation and went on to quote from the prophet Joel "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams." [Joel 2:28, Acts 2: 17]. From this rousing speech, the Acts of the Apostles takes us through the early years as the Church spread out in response to the Last Commission the Disciples received from Jesus. "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." [Mark 16:15] Two thousand years later, that is our mission as we aim to be a visible spiritual presence in our communities as we strive to make Jesus known to all.
